


It's been an honor and privilege to be your President this past year and I look forward to serving you again during an exciting and fun 2019!



The AMA show was crammed with beautiful models, including the one below. The PBY was originally manufactured in San Diego by Consolidated.




F4U-1 Corsair "L.A. City Limits"

Scratch built, all Wood from Don Smith Plans ¼ Scale 122" Wingspan, Moki 250 Radial Engine












Stein Adler

This Giant scale glider was purchased from the AMA Foundation "RC resale" by Cal Orr. This 25 foot wing span 70 pound glider is flown with a JR radio and 8 servos including air brakes and tow release.


The tow plane is a 1/3 scale Piper Cub powered with a DA-170 flown by Lonnie Morrison. To date we have logged 11 flights with 22 good landings.

The full scale Stein Adler (Golden Eagle) gliders were built in Australia by Erwin Musger and first flew in 1951. The wood glider has a wing span of 58 feet and a gross weight of 1058 pounds. The glider was designed as a two seat tandem training glider and also performed well in the two seat class in World Glider Championships in the 1950's. Several are still flying.






Tom got to 'buddy-box' Patrick as he taught Patrick how to fly! Yeah! Right!





Doesn't your editor's B-24 look full-scale in flight? This plane glides like an angel. When landing it, I shut down the 4 motors while the plane flies the downwind leg. It then turns 90 degrees toward the flight line, turns another 90 onto the flight line on final and the plane continues to glide in for a dead stick perfect landing! It is the easiest plane to fly! Seriously! The folks at Motion R/C did their homework!

Chris Thompson has refurbished these used planes. He does a great job on airbrush painting!! This is a British Hawk jet from Freewing.

Our Navy uses them as trainers flying off carriers. This one is done in the Finnish air force scheme. It was originally red, but Chris painted it in camouflage colors and applied Finnish markings from Callie Graphics. (*Note the fog defrosters on canopy for the pilots cockpit.*)

He added aluminum sprung tri-landing gear. It has a 70 mm electric ducted fan and the 6S battery is 4500 mAh. He also is flying this German BF-109 in the desert scheme from FMS. The wingspan is 1400 mm with 3-blade prop and is all electric with retracts. The 4S battery is 3300 mAh. Both have lights on wings, and check weathering painted on ailerons on this one. He has also added wires down the struts of landing gear to represent hydraulics.

Chris also has another new electric Pitts SIS bipe from E-flite. It has a 4S battery 3300 mAh. (On next page)









George Sullivan has a new PC-21 electric ARF from FMS. It has a 4S battery 5000 mAh.


Tom Pollinger is flying both of these new planes. His other warbird is a Hawker Hurricane with a 3blade prop from


