



We are also going to have our annual Holiday Christmas Party and Awards back this year. Mark your calendars for December 4 at the San Marcos Senior Center, More information coming soon.


Remember to get your Club Officer and Board nominations to me by our next club meeting October 23.









### **Bill Hill's SALTO H-101 Flies Again**

A while back Bill decided to part ways with his beautiful 4 meter SALTO H-101. The original SALTO H-101 was designed by Ursula Hanel, she was the widow of Eugen Hanel, former Director of Glasflügel. The SALTO 101 was based on the Glasflügel Standard Libelle H201. It was designed for aerobatics. It was a 13 meter sailplane.

Bill's H-100 was built by Baudismodel which is based in the Czech Republic. They have an excellent reputation in the RC scale sailplane model business. This model is 3.25:1 scale.




After replacing all the servo's and installing IDS systems on the flaps and ailerons and working on some of the blemishes that needed help the day came that it had to fly. Ken Kaye agreed to tow on a Friday.



The first tow was done with no problems. The plane is very stable on  $tow_{48}$ The release was done at about 500 feet and trimming began. The plane responded very well with little to no trimming required. (Text and photos by Jim Gallacher)

The landing was the big fear in my mind. But this turned out to be a non-event. The SALTO responds very well to the rather large flaps. The landing was uneventful. After letting the adrenaline disperse from my systems we tried another tow. This tow was to 700 feet this flight was to explore the thermalling ability of the H101. With very few thermals to find the circles were done with very low banking angles. At one point I lost visibility with the plane pointing directly at me, the next time I saw it I was looking at the bottom of the H-101with the wings vertical. The dreaded SPIN entry was fully developed. In the next 5 minutes I mean seconds I lost 200 FEET. The first 2.5 seconds was gobbled up trying to figure out what just happened. The rest of the time was used in recovering from the spin. Going in to this series of flights were I was convinced I would have trouble with the landings. In fact it was the visibility of an all-white aircraft and flying too slow in a thermal turn which bit me.



See if you can find the spin entry point on this trace.

Before the next flights the bottom of the wings will be painted RED.



President Emeritus Bill Hill gave a report on our latest efforts to locate a new flying site. Perhaps San Diego County may help us!




