

Pit Tables @ Field

The restraining dowels on our tables that prevent our airplanes from moving forward after we start their engines have been getting loose. On June 24, 2011, I installed slightly larger oak dowels with new foam sleeves. Thus, our tables are safer. I reduced the diameter of each dowel only on one end. Thus, if they fit too tightly, please remove the dowel, slide the foam sleeve to the other end, and replace the thinner end in the hole. Most of the retaining holes are $\frac{3}{4}$ " diameter. Some are slightly larger while some are slightly smaller. Either way, one end or the other should fit.

Many men clean off the aluminum tops after using them. Thanks so much for your courtesy to us who come after you and use them for our planes. It's so nice to set a plane down on a clean table top, isn't it? Most men are thoughtful and clean up after themselves. Thanks for your thoughtfulness.

Maynard Hill (1926-2011)

The Wall Street Journal for June 11-12 ran an article about Maynard, whom they called "The Lindberg of Hobbyists." Why call him this? In August 2002, Maynard flew a model airplane from Cape Spear, Newfoundland to Ireland, almost 1,900 miles away. The model had just a 6 foot wingspan and was the first r/c model to cross the Atlantic! It took him several years to develop the airplane from balsa and red monokote. He also developed a light four cycle engine and an autopilot guided by GPS. He used Coleman stove fuel and believe it or not, the plane needed less than a gallon for the entire trip according to the article.

In 1962, Maynard set the altitude record of 12,960 feet for an r/c plane. It was the first of 25 world records he set, each one marked by nailing a prop to his hobby shop door in Silver Springs, Md.

He was legally blind when he conceived the idea of the trans-Atlantic flight and his wife brought him to Newfoundland for the event.

Maynard was one of the greats in this hobby and his passing deserves recognition.

Marine Corps Museum @ Mira Mar

The museum is small and has about 5 or 6 propeller aircraft and about as many helicopters. It has a number of jets and a trailer that serves as a gift shop and place for airplane memorabilia. Our club donated \$2,000. to the museum about 8 years ago. They hope to someday build a huge hangar to accommodate all their aircraft which not are outdoors. This is a private venture whichreceives no funds from the Marines. A Corsair painted in midnight black as used in Korea is my favorite plane along with a Sikorsky S-55 and S-58. Projected cost of a new museum building is between \$43 and \$70 million!

CLUB MEETING MINUTES CONTINUED

We will have Tom Atwood as our guest speaker at the August membership meeting. Tom is the former editor of Model Airplane News and Editor in-chief of RC Driver magazine. Tom has flown an R/C plane all the way around Manhattan Island. Probably never again possible with the restrictions on aircraft that we now live with.

After the break, a presentation was given by our guest speaker, Frank Voorman. Frank spoke of his experiences before and during WWll as a pilot flying P-38 Lightnings in a photo recon. group. His team was continuation of General Chennault's famous Flying Tigers. He and his fellow pilots flew over Southeast Aisa in UNARMED P-38s. Some missions lasting as long as 12 hours of flying, using drop tanks to have enough fuel for the round trip. He stated that if they were flying into known hostile areas that "they would be escorted by additional armed P-38s to fly protective cover". Three cameras were in use to provide the filming angles needed to produce a long range picture of the terrain. A question was asked about flying a twin engine aircraft such as the P-38 with one engine out. He said, "it required some delicate stick control but was possible when the situation called for it". I smiled when Frank said his dog often went with him on many flights. He said, "My dog used to ride along wrapped around the radio box". From an inspector at the Curtis Aircraft Factory, inspecting P-40s as they rolled off of the assembly line prior to enlisting, to piloting his P-38 during the war, Frank has served his country well. We appreciate him taking the time to visit and share his experiences with our club members.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:25 pm.
