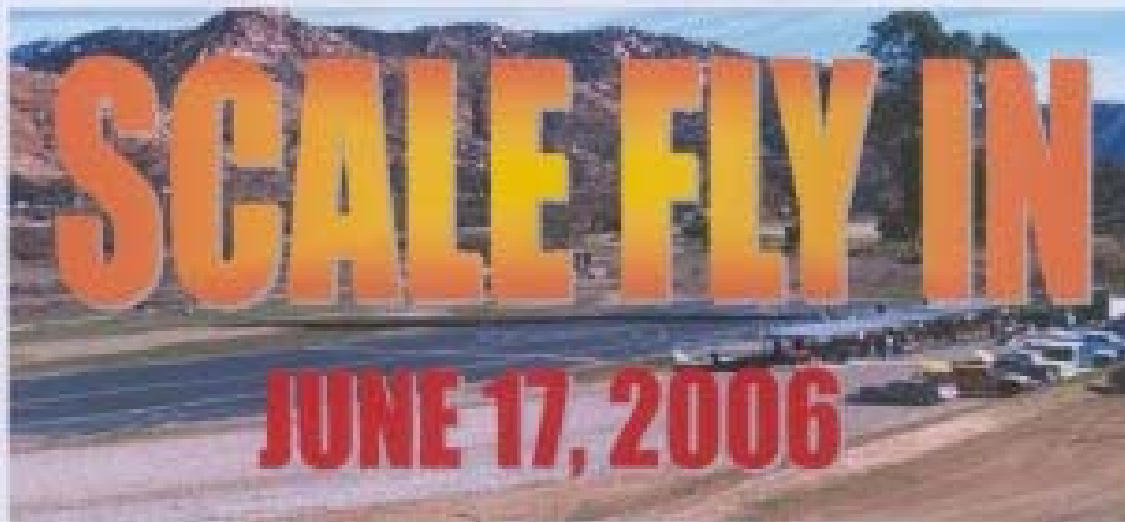

Model of the Month



Model of the month was won by Gregory Frank with a park flyer of his own design. The Greg special has a wingspan of 31" and weighs 15 ounces. Greg says the plane cost him about \$3.00 in foam and about \$80.00 in electronics. It uses a brushless motor of unknown manufacturer that develops about 21oz of thrust. The outstanding feature of this plane is it's articulating motor mount which allows vectored thrust to be applied to the motor and slaved to the rudder and elevator through transmitter mixing. The audience found this very interesting and we saw it flying at Fallbrook and doing very unusual aerobatics. Greg noted that his motor mount design is patented, so don't try to copy it verbatim.

Superior Pilot's Corner

"A pilot that uses superior judgment to keep his butt out of situations that might cause him to have to use his superior flying skills."

GET SOME SKILLS

It just doesn't happen without some effort.

Many new pilots are happy to be able to fly a trainer after they solo.

But after spending some effort to learn how to fly by yourself, you should continue to develop the additional skills that are needed to become a superior pilot. This skill is not simply acquired, but takes a plan to continue learning and mastering the fine points of flying RC. Acquiring the judgment to know your own limits is not easy. Here are the tools:

1. Read. Spend some time with RC information available in magazines,

books, on the internet, forums, etc. Look for common sense approaches

to construction, safety and flying tips. Make notes or file this information so it is always available. See if you can pick out the good stuff from the BS.

2. Participate. Attend RC activities where there are experienced flyers. Get involved as an observer, judge, recorder, official, or whatever capacity that you can. You will be surprised at how much experience will rub off when you actually get involved. As you acquire the necessary skills, increase your participation.

3. Practice what you learn. As you learn about new skills, do more than just file them away, practice them! This is a key to extending your RC

abilities. DO NOT JUST CONTINUE TO DO THE SAME THING EVERY TIME YOU FLY! To acquire a new skill, you must try it yourself. It may not be your cup of tea, but the only way to know is to try it.

4. Ask for help - an overlooked quick way to acquire some skill.

Identify someone with the skill you want to acquire and ask for help. Even in competitive events, almost all RC flyers are willing to share their experience and help you acquire the skills that you seek. You can save yourself many mistakes by learning about the virtual mistakes of others.

5. Master new skills. Learn at your own pace - Don't continue to overextend your ability. Give yourself plenty of margin for error and gain absolute confidence through practice. Each person has different talents, so some things that are easy for others may not be easy for you and vice versa. By practicing at your own pace, you can avoid making major mistakes (and the coincident expense and embarrassment.) Continued practice will bring confidence and mastery.

Have you tried something new lately? Now go fly right.

- Check Security - Engine, fuel tank, wheels, receiver, battery, servos.
- Pull Test - Linkages and control surfaces.
- Receiver Antenna - Fully extended and away from metal.
- Verify Center of gravity location.
- Conduct Range Test- with transmitter antenna collapsed.

PRE-FLIGHT(EACH FLIGHT)

- Check receiver voltage under load.
- Check transmitter power level.
- Check engine high speed, nose up.
- Check engine idle, nose down.
- Extend transmitter antenna.
- Check control surface direction and response.
