Meeting Minutes

General Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m., July 21, 2005

1. The president discussed briefly, the broken promises by the Ramona Airfair Committee which eliminated much of the club's flight time in favor of full scale aerobatic aircraft. The President recommend we seriously reconsider participation in the Ramona Airfare in favor of a closer or bigger airshow.
2. The President lauded the "trash" work party, led by Varley Longson, which tidied up the storage bin area eliminating unnecessary junk that was merely lying around and sited by San Diego County as "eyesore".
3. The President congratulated David Truax and company for another fine Pylon event. He noted that the pylon events seem to be on their way back as many more spectators and participants attended this past event.
4. The President reminded the Club of the upcoming "Flight's of Fancy" event, encourage participation by increasing the amount of Palomar dollars that

August 2005 President's Column

August is here...and so are we! ...at the flying field, that is to say.

Those of you, who did not come to the July Club meeting, are probably saying: "What's this guy talking about?" Well, to give you a recap in the "Reader's Digest" version, the County of San Diego had planned to shut us down unless we paid them a \$10,000.00, (ten thousand dollars) "Use fee" by August 1, 2005.

Apparently, the Building Inspector's office was pushing the County Planning office to be allowed to levy fines against us for non-permitted structures. By law, the Building Inspector could not take legal action until the "Use Permit" issue was resolved. At the last minute, County Supervisor Bill Horn's office interceded on our behalf. His office managed to secure a two month extension on the use-permit filing deadline allowing time for the head of the Planning Commission to examine why a non-profit organization, not selling any food, on private property should be required to file a use-permit application. We shall await to see the ulti-

mate outcome.

What we do know now is that our troubles came from a disgruntled person who attended our car track races over a year ago. Apparently that person reported that we were selling food to the County of San Diego and our troubles began. We have assured the County of San Diego, that the Palomar R/C Flyers have not sold food on the premises during my tenure as President, nor do we intend to do so! Given these facts, as a club we are merely a non-profit 501 C3 corporation and not legally subject to a County "use-permit". We do have private vendors that will now be selling food at our bigger events, but these people have their own County issued licenses and are otherwise "San Diego County" legal!

We shall see how this unfolds. Eventually, however, we will need to either get the building inspector to approve our sun shades, (those over 300 square feet), modify them, or worst case scenario...tear them down! First things first... we wait for the County's ultimate ruling on the use permit. Special thanks go to our point-man on this project, Tom Minegar. Tom has gone above the call of duty in time and effort on this one! Thanks Tom!

Finally, our landlord sent us a "lease agreement" in which he offered us the premises for \$1.00 a year. But then he asked us to put forth a \$5,000.00 deposit! His attorneys stated that the County required

the deposit in addition to the \$10,000.00 use permit. Tom discussed the matter with the landlord's attorney and the amount was reduced to \$2500.00 assuming we are still required to get a "use-permit." It is my hope that if we prevail on the "use-permit" issue, our landlord will waive the deposit. Again, we shall see!

As many of you know this month has been emotionally and physically demanding on the board of directors and me.

We did however have a very successful Fourth of July picnic with about 150 people attending, primarily during lunch time. I hope everyone had a good time and had enough to eat!

We also had a very successful "Flights of Fancy" event! Many of our members participated and the kids seemed to really enjoy their day at the field. I personally supervised the free flight "Delta Dart" Contest and awarded the winner with a new R/C ARF airplane. (See Gary Thompson's Flights of Fancy Article for details and kudos to the workers.) Thank you Gary, and crew for another fantastic Flights of Fancy event!

We had another very successful Pylon event. I personally judge a few rounds and awarded the victory to the highest bidder....I mean fastest airplane! Make sure you see Dave Truax's article for race results. I want to personally thank all those that worked at the Pylon event in the sweltering summer heat!

Finally, by the time you read this article, we should already have hosted the San Diego Electric Scale Show. I hope you all attended and had fun watching the "newer" end of our hobby!

- Check Security - Engine, fuel tank, wheels, receiver, battery, servos.
- Pull Test - Linkages and control surfaces.
- Receiver Antenna - Fully extended and away from metal.
- Verify Center of gravity location.
- Conduct Range Test- with transmitter antenna collapsed.

PRE-FLIGHT(EACH FLIGHT)

- Check receiver voltage under load.
- Check transmitter power level.
- Check engine high speed, nose up.
- Check engine idle, nose down.
- Extend transmitter antenna.
- Check control surface direction and response.

5. The President reminded the Club of the upcoming "scale electric show" and again encouraged the club to volunteer for the various work activities to earn palomar dollars.
6. The President discussed the recent problems with the County over the use of the field. Board member, Tom Minegar, outlined the negotiations with the county, in which the County demanded we pay a "use permit fee" by July 31, 2005 and the landlord demanded we pay a \$5000.00 "deposit" or cease flying by July 31, 2005. (We have a sixty day reprieve as of this date, while the county figures out why it was trying to charge a non-profit social group a use permit fee)
7. The President stated to the club, with eloquent inserts by Tom Minegar, that county has literally pushed our use of the San Marcos landfill to a very small area near housing that has methane gas pipes a foot or so above ground throughout the area. The County of San Diego apparently does not want the City of San Marcos to have any activity on the site for 3-4 years.

9. Thumb of the month went to our illustrious fearless leader, for his death defying near avoidance with mother earth during the end of the Ramona Air show combat event.
10. The meeting was adjourned at 9:30 p.m. and the raffle commenced.

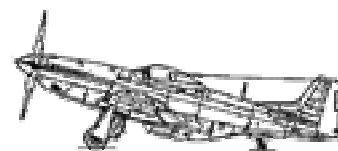

Scale Notes

GETTING YOUR MODEL

PUBLISHED

Every model magazine is currently begging for all types of articles with a special interest in 'how to' and construction.

Why do you want to publish? Fame? Money? To share the fun!!

What kind of article do you want to do? Construction? General? How to?..

How do I start?

A. **Subject** - should be something not done in the magazines recently.

1. Unusual, special purpose, aerobatics, scale, beginner.
2. Scale - Documentation
 - a. Three views (Banka, Model plans service etc.)
 - b. History of aircraft or famous pilot.
 - c. Paint scheme (factory or current owner, military)

B. **Size/Scale** - consider

1. Engine size(s)
2. Wing span & will wings be removable?
3. Cowl size and type
 - a. Will muffler fit inside?
 - b. Will engine head show?
 - c. Adequate cooling air flow?
4. Canopy - is a commercial canopy available?
5. Will standard size/type wheels be available?
6. Does model have good design moments, arms, and areas?

C. **Plans**

1. Working drawings - may be pencil with little detail on any paper.

Side, top, and front views may be needed to develop formers, ribs, construction details, etc.

2. Finished pencil drawing- may be done on vellum using working drawings to arrange on minimum area of sheet. Some drawings used to develop formers, etc., may not be required on the finished drawing.

3. Final drawing will be in ink on vellum and will probably be done by a professional draftsman hired by

the magazine. Costs of drawing will be subtracted from your payment.

D. **Photos** - take plenty!!!! at least 100 total shots. more is better

All photos should be captioned - do not write on back of photos. Write caption on a gummed label and paste on back.

All photos with an identifiable person in them will need a model release from that person. Photo stores often have generic forms.

1. Construction - general views and any special technique required that cannot easily be drawn on the plans. (E.g. fairings)
2. Finished aircraft - think about magazine format (portrait) to allow possible cover photo. (color only for cover!)
3. Flight shots - get some in-flight shots using the best camera available to you.
4. Films - first preference is Kodak slide film for color (use lowest guide number [64] for best resolution). Use Kodak Plus X (guide 125) for black and white. New black and white film using color film chemistry may be acceptable. If any question, ask the editor. Color prints may be usable, but generally are harder to get good color saturation and light range.
5. Cameras - best is 35mm through the lens focus type. The automatic quick shot viewfinder cameras generally will not focus for good close up shots. Use a tripod wherever you can! Hand held photos almost always have some 'jiggle' that leads to a blurry photo. Scanning the photos for printing will cost some sharpness anyhow. You will probably need a decent flash to properly light some shots.

TIPS: Plan your shot to minimize background clutter. FILL the frame with the model, not the neighbor's fence or the knees of the person holding the plane. Avoid long shots. Good flying shots will probably require a long (200mm focal length minimum) lens. Think about color balance. Photos taken indoors with fluorescent lights on will have a distinct greenish cast. People will look ghastly. Photos taken with incandescent lighting may have a strong yellowish cast unless filtered properly. Bright sun can produce shadows beyond the range of the film.

E. **Publication** -

resume and general text you propose to start the article. You need a strong first paragraph to get the editors attention. Photos of the completed plane should accompany this letter. Include span, engine size, and other special details.

Find editor listed at front of each magazine you submit to. Submit to one magazine at a time!

2. Acceptance/rejection letter. You will get one or the other and if accepted payment procedure will be spelled out. I.E.: on publication, or on acceptance. The magazine will generally want first right of publication and rights to sell plans, if applicable. You may be able to sell the design after publication with the magazines permission.

Magazine will send you a style sheet to guide your article general layout and content.

3. Article text - consider the target reader (advanced, beginner, special interest)
 - a. First paragraph is most important of article. Make it work
 - b. Describe construction in enough detail so another builder with the assumed skills can reproduce your model.
 - c. Be sure to describe critical procedures
 - d. Discuss flight trim and control movements, what kind of flying the builder should expect.
 - e. Most construction articles run about 1500 to 3000 five letter words. Your word processor will count the characters for you.

F. **Delivery** -

mail photos, model releases, hard copy of text, and a copy on a computer disk if possible. Magazines will not accept e-mail text because of the possibility of inheriting a computer virus.

G. **Payment**-

Usually payment is 30-60-90 days after publication. Some articles are paid "on acceptance".

Payment will vary with the complexity of the project and costs to the publisher for inking the plans, etc. Pay is often discussed in the 'style sheets'.

Photos may be returned at some date after publication. Artwork generated for the cover, etc., was always


