A night fly was held on Saturday night and the crowd went wild. An E powered hand hunched glider flew at what Don estimated to be 200 mph. Warren Elsasser was our after break speaker. Warren was a Navy aviation maintenance officer and then went to the civilian sector after retirement, buying equipment for the Air Force and then selling equipment to the Air Force. Warren told about getting performance requirements and then working with engineers to develop equipment to meet or exceed those specs. The Global Hawk was one of the UAV projects that Warren worked on. The Hawk can fly at 60,000 feet at 300 mph. It has a wing span of 134 ft and a fuse length of 49 feet. It uses jp5&8 fueland has flown from Edwards AFB to Australia. A very interesting presentation. Jimmy brought in a Thunder Tiger titanium heli to show off. It uses a Thunder Tiger 50 engine and has a flashy fiberglass canopy that Jimmy bought at the fun fly. After purchasing the kit, Jimmy found that "titanium" referred to the color of the aluminum support tubes. Oh well


- Tom Johnston brings out a kit he built & covered of an Eindecker EIII by Balsa USA with a .90 Surpass 4-stroke engine.


Building of Top Flite 60 size F4U Corsair Kit








ASSEMBLY INSPECTION

- Check Security Engine, fuel tank, wheels, receiver, battery, servos.
- Pull Test Linkages and control surfaces.
- Receiver Antenna Fully extended and away from metal.
- Verify Center of gravity location.
- Conduct Range Test- with transmitter antenna collapsed.

PRE-FLIGHT(EACH FLIGHT)

- Check receiver voltage under load.
- Check transmitter power level.
- Check engine high speed, nose up.
- Check engine idle, nose down.
- Extend transmitter antenna.
- Check control surface direction and response.
