6:30 - Role Call. Motion to approve previous meeting minutes approved.

6:31 - Treasury report by Doug Abel: \$2,039.00 income - \$514.33 expenses - \$1,794.67 net income - \$54,099 balance.

6:34 - Mark Olsen on Fight Training - We had five complete solo flights with experienced pilots who were all cleare fly. No new pilots in the last month. Currently, there are four pilots in the training program who are making good gress and doing exceptionally well!

6:40 - Mark Olsen on safety - No significant safety matters over the last month. There was an incident involving aircraft that crashed in the pits, which was handled promptly at the time of the incident.

6:44 - Joe Villereal on Valley Center HS: Joe contacted Mr. Barnett via email, who is the science teacher at Valley Center HS, about science students who might be interested in model aviation and givingthem access to our site. Mr. Barnett has not responded to Joe's email.

6:46 - Don Davis on Gate Cards: The gate card issue has been resolved - Jim Christy has new cards for our m bership!

6:50 - Don Davis discussed the new Event Application Form and brought it up for discussion. It was agreed that would present the new event application form to the membership at the next club meeting and get a vote for adoptine application into the club's bylaws.

6:58 - Don Davis brought up the Holiday Party date and how we accept registration payments. We want members to be able to pay for the party in multiple ways, making it as easy as possible, and the Board agreed. We will have our normal programming, with a few additions. Motion approved with 5 yes votes. 3 Board members did not respond.





## **Launching a Powered Sailplane** (A minor note)


When we ask someone to launch a sailplane, they often respond, "How do you want me to launch it? Up or level?" We answer, "Level."

When we take off a fixed wing plane, at what angle does it begin its takeoff run? It runs down the runway with its wings level and when it reaches take-off speed, the plane rotates.

Often a sailplane has no wheel to allow it to takeoff, so we hand launch it with wings level to the ground. You might say we are providing a *quasi* take off run. With a larger sailplane, hold it above your head so you don't clip the back of your neck with the stab when launching. With full power, the plane quickly gains speed and altitude. Leave the climbing to the motor, not your arm.

Some launchers feel they have to launch at a noticeable up angle to make the plane gain altitude instantly. Not so. The plane doesn't need that kind of help. It needs to first gain flying speed and then it can climb. If it is launched at an up angle, the plane needs to level off to be able to increase its speed and then it can safely climb.

This is a minor note, but a hand launch straight ahead and level is helpful.




